



Statement by the International Food and Beverage Alliance (IFBA) on the 2018 Access to Nutrition Global Index Report

London, 23 May 2018 – The International Food and Beverage Alliance (IFBA) welcomes the publication of the Access to Nutrition Foundation (ATNF) Global Index 2018. IFBA appreciates ATNI’s assessment of companies’ progress on, and further recommendations for, supporting consumers to eat balanced diets and live healthier lives.

The ATNI Report 2018 recognizes the increasing progress that the world’s leading food and beverage companies have made overall in transforming products to be more nutritious and available in smaller portion sizes, increasing consumer access to nutrition facts, responsible marketing, and investing in health and wellness programs for employees and local communities.

With eleven of the twenty companies assessed in the 2018 ATNI Report being IFBA members, we are proud that in many instances IFBA’s own public progress reports are referenced and served as a resource to inform the report.
